The transition to the polyclinic

20. London has some healthcare facilities that come close to our vision of a polyclinic. For instance, the Heart of Hounslow Centre for Health has GP services, outpatient care, physiotherapy, dentistry, podiatry, social care

outreach, mental health services for children and a gym to help in rehabilitation. All these services take place in a purpose-built facility that covers six floors. However, the centre does not provide urgent care and only has a limited range of diagnostics. So we have to look abroad to see a full example of a polyclinic.
